TRUSTEE REPORT

MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAIR

2019 was another successful year for Boardmatch. The team successfully navigated a new website build that will modernise the digital experience of our candidates, corporates and not-for-profits and the size of this task of integrating the new website should not be under-estimated. Praise should go to the team. especially Hannah Coleman, for their efforts in making this seem like a straightforward process. I would also like to thank our trustee Fred Karlsson for his excellent work in this area. The new website transition did not negatively impact our matches which stayed at a high level, over 300 for the 2nd year in a row at 316. Of these 316 placements, Boardmatch achieved an almost 50-50 gender split (actual numbers 51% male, 49% female) and placed individuals in 17 counties across all 4 provinces.

In fact. 2019 was a year when Boardmatch really began to demonstrate its reach and ability to the not-for-profit support sector throughout Ireland. The new website attracted 45,000 visits (80% increase 2019 2018) In the team on coordinated 13 training sessions in Dublin, Cork, Kilkenny, Galway, Sligo, and three bespoke in-house trainings (217 attendees). It was a conscious decision taken by the CEO and the board to bring Boardmatch's expertise across the country. This was also an opportunity for us to futureproof our training by bringing in another trainer with expertise in

board governance and Charity Trustees.

The highlight of the year for the Boardmatch team was possibly the Trustee Speed-Dating event, which took place in late November. Having held the inaugural event in 2018. Boardmatch made the 2019 event a much bigger affair with 50 charities and 100 candidates attending, and 40 subsequent board & Committee appointments. The accompanying feedback from both candidates and charities was extremely positive. We would also like to thank our event sponsors, Arthur Cox, BHP Insurance and Hays Recruitment. Our CEO, Eva Gurn, conceived of the Speed-Dating idea and should be commended on her vision and tenacity on bringing this concept to a reality, an event which really stands out in the not-forprofit calendar.

Finally, the board of Boardmatch continued to evolve in 2019. Denise Fitzgerald resigned her seat at the board after 5 years of excellent service to Boardmatch. We welcomed Liz Roche to the board who brings fundraising considerable and marketing experience from the notfor-profit sector to the board. The board is looking forward to 2020 where we hope to use our new online platform and growing presence nationally to continue Boardmatch's growth.

ABOUT BOARDMATCH IRELAND

Boardmatch Ireland is the only charity in Ireland whose primary service is matching individuals to the boards of not-for-profits. Through this, Boardmatch are supporting the development of the community and voluntary sector (the not-for-profit sector) by strengthening boards and management committees by ensuring they have the correct skills to create the most impact in Communities all over Ireland. Boardmatch do this primarily through:

- **Board Recruitment Services**: Our Free Matching Website that connects charities and not-for-profits with board vacancies with individuals looking to volunteer at board level, and our Premium Search service is a bespoke board recruitment service for charities with additional needs or limited resources
- **Board and Trustee Training**: A range of training and review offerings for trustees and boards around Ireland
- **Corporate Programmes**: Our corporate programmes engage employees and have a positive impact on the Irish not-for-profit sector

Boardmatch Ireland was established in 2005 to address the skills gaps on the boards of not-for-profit organisations. It was established by a strong board including Mary Redmond of Arthur Cox, Siobhan Toale of Bank of Ireland, Roger Acton of ACCA, Kieran Loughran of the Disability Federation of Ireland and Mary Davis of Special Olympics, a group of dynamic individuals wanting to encourage citizen participation. Both Mary Redmond and Mary Davis were members of the Task Force for Active Citizenship formed in 2006 by Government to address the lack of citizens getting involved with Community and Voluntary activities.

Boardmatch is the only Irish charity that specialises in connecting people from all sectors for mutual benefit, to enable individuals to give back at a strategic level and become Trustees of Charity Boards.

By the end of 2019, Boardmatch facilitated the appointment of over 2,600 candidates to the boards of not-for-profit organisations countrywide.





PREMIUM SEARCH SERVICE

- FOR NOT-FOR-PROFITS -

The Premium Search Service is a fully managed executive-search by Boardmatch for Not-For-Profit Boards. This enables organisations to focus on the operational whilst their Board Recruitment is taken care of by an experienced Charity Account Manager. The Premium Search Service has had a 100% success rate to date in finding trustees for Not-For-Profit Boards.

In 2019, 52 new trustees were placed through the Premium Search Service. These placements were spread across five counties – Dublin, Kildare, Louth, Limerick, and Cork indicating the need for this service throughout Ireland. Boardmatch worked with a wide variety of different organisations, large and small, as outlined in our Premium Charity testimonials emphasizing the importance of investing in Governance.
